

Ancient Greek Translations

I want to share with you some answers given by school children in their exams: Noah's wife was called Joan of the Ark.

A myth is a female moth.

The Fifth Commandment is "Humour your father and mother."

Lot's wife was a pillar of salt by day and a ball of fire by night. The point is: right answers are important, but have you thought about this ? So are right questions! So the right question I want to raise with you today is this: How do you spend your time?

The New Testament was written originally in common (ancient) Greek and the Greeks had two words for time - chronos and kairos. Chronos, which give us our word chronology, is tick-tock time. Each second is exactly like the one that preceded and the one that follows it. It is boring time, humdrum time, drudgery time, meaningless time, empty time. Let me paint the picture of chronos time. Imagine a convict in a prison cell: a lawyer with insomnia. who hears the unrelenting incessant ticking of a clock; or an office worker who hates his job and can't wait for 5:00 pm to come so he can get out of there; all experience chronos time. Chronos time is empty time; it is time we must "put in" or endure. It's what we are talking about when we talk about "killing" time. So, chronos equals tick-tock time, humdrum time, boring time, and routine time.



Thank God, there is another kind of time. Translated, kairos mans the "right time" or "opportune moment" and some scholars include kairos as delivering a speech at the right time and place in the right way for a particular audience. In the New Testament kairos is used for "an appointed time" that God had chosen for something to occur, and it is understood in Christian practice as an opportunity to serve our Lord. Kairos is productive time, working to help others and living a fulfilling life rather "killing time"

So, based on the Greek version, you can spend your time sitting staring at your IPad or at the opportune time (right now?) by serving our lord. How do you plan to spend your time today?
