Daylight Lasts Longer John 11:1-45

A couple who lived in Pinjarra had tried for many years to have a baby. Some years ago they were overjoyed when a baby boy, who they named Steven, finally arrived. Naturally they were very protective of their only child. When he was six years old and had started attending school he was allowed to visit friends' homes after school and play with them. However his parents gave Steven very strict instructions to come home from



playing every afternoon by no later than 5p.m.. His parents were quite serious about Steven's curfew and if he wasn't home by 5 p.m., they'd begin to worry and call around the neighbourhood to find out where he was. Steven knew this and was usually careful to arrive home on time.

In early November, the day after Daylight Saving Time came into effect, Steven was late coming home. When he finally arrived home, a few minutes before 6 p.m., his mother scolded him for being late. "You know you are to be home by five," she said, "and here it is nearly six."

Steven was puzzled and pointed out the window. "But the light," he protested, "the light; it's the light that tells me when to come home."

Realizing what had happened, his mother smiled and gently explained that the day before the time had been changed and everyone had reset their clocks . Now the daylight lasted longer. Her son's eyes narrowed. "Does God know about this?" he asked suspiciously.

In a childlike way, this little boy shared John's story of the resurrection of Lazarus. Jesus wanted his disciples and all of his followers, including you and me, to know that with God daylight lasts longer than death.
