#### Feeding the 5000

There is a funny story about a nine-year-old named Danny who came bursting out of Sunday school. After a guick search, he grabbed his dad's trouser leg and yelled, "That story about Moses and all those people crossing the Red Sea was great!" His father looked down, smiled, and asked his son to tell him about it. "Well. the Israelites got out of Egypt, but Pharaoh and his army chased after them. So the Jews ran as fast as they could until they got to the Red Sea. The Egyptian Army was getting closer and closer, so Moses got on his mobile phone and told the Israeli Air Force to bomb the Egyptians. While that was happening, the Israeli Navy built a pontoon bridge so the people could cross over and



so they escaped the Edyptians". Danny's dad was shocked. "Is THAT the way they taught you the story?" Well, no, not exactly," said Danny, "but if I told you the way they told it to us. vou'd never believe it!"

With childlike innocence the little boy had put his finger on the pulse of our sophisticated adult world where cool scepticism reigns supreme. It's more popular to operate in the black-and-white world of facts...and, of course, to leave no space for the miraculous.

So when we read the story of the feeding of the five thousand, we tend to focus our attention on the question, "Did it really happen?" There have been a number of attempts to "explain" the miracle. One attempt says that the people were so moved by Jesus' generosity and that they brought out the food they had hidden under their clothes and in their traveling pouches. This way everyone was satisfied. Another theory says that the story is not really talking about physical hunger but spiritual hunger. When the small amount of food was passed around everyone tore off a minuscule symbolic fragment. In this Jesus is said to have satisfied the thirst of the soul not the stomach.

I think these questions say more about us than they do Jesus. Jesus is the Messiah and there is no question that he regularly performed miracles. The point of the story of feeding of the five thousand is not to prove that miracles happen. Rather it is to teach us that by his service Jesus is the fulfilment of the Word, and that we can and should use our abilities in Our Lord's service.
