Contestants and Bravado

Everyone loves a good duel! At least in the movies we do and Errol Flynn was an Australian actor who was well known for his dashing personality and fiery sword duels. Our hero goes up against a worthy foe, and we hold our breath while the opponents or contestants raise their swords, commence, and fight to the bitter end. The "dual" usually comes about in order to defend someone's honour —whether one's own, a friend's, or a maiden's. In the end, we hope that our hero will win, and honour will be restored.



When we think about contestants today, however, we rarely think about duels. We think primarily of game shows. One "contestant" faces off with another in a challenge of wits. We root for the contender, or in some cases, the underdog, but the only "honour" upheld is that of one person's ability to outthink or outmanoeuvre another. Whether duelling men or game show contestants though, both events issue from some sort of provocation, dispute, or challenge, in which something (honour, superior acumen, or strength) must be proved through some sort of testing procedure.

The idea of truth through testing for the purposes of striving to "win" in a dispute comes from a much earlier definition of "contestant." In 1600s France, a "contestant" was someone who contested or disputed something litigiously in a court of law. The opposing parties called "witnesses" to attest to the truthfulness of the contestants or facts of the matter at hand. The word derives from Latin "com" (with/together) and "testis" (a witness). Our word "testament" also comes from this same root. The Latin compound alluded to the fact that in a court of law, calling witnesses was the first step in resolving a dispute. The witnesses would "call into question" or "test" the facts presented in order to uphold one or another "contestants." Often this led to a kind of bravado, in which one or another contestants would seek to "puff up their tail feathers" in order to contest a point or influence a jury. The more threatening the trial, the more bravado would emerge in hope to derail the witnesses and sway the proceedings. In this way, many trials even today remind us of "game show" tactics — ways to divert attention, distract the challenger, or create doubt in those witnessing the event.

Contestants and Bravado

Bravado is the ultimate tool of the wily "contestant." The scriptures are full of bravado. Perhaps one of the best examples in the gospels is when Peter saw Jesus walking on the water and called to him "Lord, if it's you... tell me to come to you on the water." Jesus said "Come" and Peter did attempt to, but his courage and his faith failed him and he started to sink. Naturally Jesus saved Peter and then asked him "why did you doubt?"



Sadly, doubt is a very human thing to do. We can be full of bravado, but when faced with a challenge the doubts set in, and the bigger the challenge the quicker and more strongly those doubts arrive. However with resolve and faith in Christ, we can face our challenges and we too can say, as Jesus's disciples said 2000 years ago, "Truly you (Jesus) are the Son of God".
