Chippie the budgerigar never saw it coming. One second he was peacefully chirping away while perched in his cage. The next he was sucked in, washed up, and blown over. The problems began when Chippie's owner decided to clean Chippie's cage with a vacuum cleaner. She removed the attachment from the end of the hose and stuck it in the cage. The phone rang, and she turned to pick it up. She'd barely said "hello" when "sssslurpp!" Chippie got sucked in.



The bird's owner gasped in horror, put down the phone, turned off the vacuum cleaner, and ripped open the dust bag. There was Chippie - still alive, but stunned.
