The Unmasking of Nazareth

The "Phantom of the Opera," "Mardi Gras Celebration," "Halloween," the movie "The Mask" – and I'm sure many more. All times when masks are worn. We as people in fact have a kind of fascination with masking, whether we are masking ourselves or unsure of who lies behind the mask of someone else. Masks for us intrigue us and reveal our excitement for mystery and the unknown. What lurks behind the mask of the "Phantom?" We want to know. Is he disfigured? Shy? A hero? A psychopath? Our curiosity



keeps us hooked until the end when his true nature is revealed. Who is it behind the masks at Halloween? Children love that guessing game as much as the game of "hide and seek." From masquerade "who done it" parties to blindfolded party games like "pin the tail on the donkey," we find it great fun to "hide," even if just for a little while.

Let's face it. We adore our masks. We adore our masks in society too, in our social circles, and in our churches. Masks allow ourselves to put forth a "persona" that we like more than we like ourselves. Masks allow us to project a personality that seems more acceptable to others than we perceive we will be accepted for ourselves. Masks permit us to be "one way" and "seem another" in ways that we find socially most advantageous to us --until we are revealed. Until the "lights" are turned on and we stand "naked" and "exposed" for exactly who we are.

In our scripture for today, Jesus is that "light" -- that brash "revealing" ray that centres on Nazareth in a rather harsh way. In one swift act, he reveals their hidden motives, nature, self-righteousness, entitlement, expectations, judgments, and artificial sweetness. And like the face of the "phantom," what emerges is not pretty—the people of Nazareth can't accept that one "of their own" is their saviour. It wasn't just Jesus who unmasked himself, it was the people of his home town and they formed a "lynch mob" not dissimilar to the one at his execution. Sadly that day in Nazareth, because the people thought they knew who Jesus was and he didn't fit their expectations of who the Messiah would be, they resorted to violence and tried to kill him. How many people in the modern world can't or don't recognise the son of God?
